## Love By Serving, and Lent's a Good Time to Start!

The practice of giving something up for Lent is an old one. Biblically, it is grounded in Luke 9:23, in which Jesus said "Whoever wants to be my disciple must deny themselves, take up their cross daily and follow me." It has long been part of Christian tradition to apply that verse to the forty days of Lent, and give something up during that time as a way to grow closer to God. It can be a really great way to feel God's presence much more frequently and powerfully. However, I'd like to encourage you to think differently about Lent this year, and to think in a way that fits our mission to "Grow in Love, Love by Serving." That way is this:

Try adding something instead.

Here's why: if you add something, then you will invariably have to cut something as well. Most of us are not sitting around with tons of free time on our calendars. Anything you add will mean something else has to go, and what that something is may surprise you. Normally when we think of giving things up for Lent we either think of guilty pleasures (chocolate being the perfect example), or bad habits that we need to kick anyway (eating too much chocolate being the perfect example). But when we *add* something, we usually end up taking away something that isn't terrible. It's something that's just...blah. Not really good, not really bad, just something we could easily replace with something better and not miss it one bit. Those things are hard to identify until something better comes along.

What might that something better be? I have two thoughts. The first, as you might expect, is to begin cultivating a regular practice of prayer and bible reading. That is the absolute first thing that I would suggest anyone add. This is the first commandment: love the Lord your God with all your heart, soul, mind and strength. But the second is like it: to love your neighbor as yourself, and so my second recommendation would be to add a form of service. This Sunday, wander over to the Council Org Chart behind the snacks and find a group to serve. Better yet, find ways to serve others without joining a program. If you see a pile of newspapers in your neighbor's driveway, bring them to them at the door.

Watch someone's pets. Trim someone's hedges. Whatever, wherever, just do *something* to make someone's life better. I'm pretty sure that would make God a lot happier than not eating chocolate, and maybe it will create a new rhythm in your life as you bear fruit for God's kingdom.

God loves you, and so do I.

Are you considering making Amazing Grace your church home? If you are, please come to the Membership Inquiry **Lunch on Sunday March**



I am sorry that a January article did not make it to the newsletter! January was an adjustment month for me with a new Coordinator as the head of the Lawrenceville Cooperative Ministry Food Bank! I am sorry if anyone was disappointed besides myself!

However by not reporting last month's 'bounty,' we can really be amazed at our numbers for February, so far! The January and February totals are 185 items! I am very proud of the number of items given for these two months! Please continue to think of our neighbors! The temperatures have been mild-ish, but hunger will always be among us!

WOW, did we have a wonderful and record breaking response for our annual Souper Bowl of Caring!!! For those who do not know about this, I will explain it to you!

The Souper Bowl of Caring is our inhouse monetary fund raiser for the Lawrenceville Coop! We held it on Super Bowl Sunday after both church services. Two containers are each marked with one of the team names that is playing in the Super Bowl! We had an AMAZING response supporting our own Atlanta Falcons VS the New England Patriots! The total votes for the Falcons was \$518.00 and change vs. the votes for the Patriots that equaled \$44.00 and change!

The big winner was the Lawrenceville Cooperative Ministry Food Bank with a total donation of \$562.77 from Amazing Grace Lutheran Church! YEA! Go AGLC! I am so excited that we supported not only the Falcons with our monetary votes, but that we also banded together to support our Lawrenceville Coop Food Bank with such gusto!

Unfortunately, the Falcons lost 2017's Super Bowl! But Amazing Grace Lutheran Church is truly Amazing with their support of the Food Bank! Thank you! Thank you! Thank you!

On behalf of NovusWay ministries, Pastor Setzler thanks Amazing Grace for their contributions to the LutheRanch fundraising campaign. NovusWay now covers 7 states in 4 synods, with 4 outdoor ministry camps. Pastor Setzler provided pamphlets with upcoming program opportunities at LutheRanch for youth and adults in 2017. August 5<sup>th</sup> is the open house at LutheRanch. August 19<sup>th</sup> is the LutheRanch Gala at the Atlanta Northeast Marriott.

**Secretary's Minutes:** The minutes from the January meeting were approved via email on January 31 2017. A motion was made by Debbie Teal and seconded by David Rager to accept the minutes, and the motion carried.

### **Combined Treasurer and Financial Administrator's Report for January**

January 2017 regular giving was \$19,024.99, plus Rental Income \$80.00, for a total of \$19,104.99, which is \$521.66 over budget. Expenses were \$23,037.92, which was \$314.53 under budget.

January 2017 YTD Income was \$5,968.88 more than January 2016 YTD Income.

January 2017 YTD Expenses were \$5,656.77 more than January 2016 YTD Expenses.

2017 Year to Date Giving/Income is \$521.66 over budget.

2017 Year to Date Expenses are \$314.53 under budget.

Dedicated Accounts – We have a balance of \$45,385.98 in various accounts, which includes January 2017 receipts of \$345.00 and expenses of \$1,227.18. Balance of Old Capital Campaign Dedicated Account, which is included in above balance equals \$2,509.88.

January 2017 cash on hand is \$103,915.93 which includes \$45,385.98 Dedicated; therefore, not in reserve/not liquid for general expenses.

When we discussed this at the last council meeting I presented incorrect figures. Last year we actually had 199 people at 11:00, which exceeds fire code by 50. We also had almost 60 at 8:30. After conversation with staff and some informal polling, I feel strongly that the best times for Easter worship are 8:30, 9:30 and 11:00, and I would like to revisit this topic at our meeting.

### 2016 Worship Attendance

Tracie has done the final calculation, and worship attendance for the year was 140. This is a roughly 20% increase over 2015, and puts us back on the same level as we had 2012-14.
