

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FROM THE PASTOR

⁸ The wind blows where it chooses, and you hear the sound of it, but you do not know where it comes from or where it goes (John 3:8).

As you may have heard, the 2019 Synod Assembly elected a new Bishop to succeed Bishop Julian Gordy who will be retiring after 12 years as Bishop of the Southeastern Synod. The Bishop elect is Reverend Kevin Strickland who assumes the office on September 1. He was raised in our Synod, and has pastored congregations in our synod, before becoming part of the church-wide staff overseeing the development of new worship materials, and Sundays and Seasons, an annual worship resource published by our denomination. Although this is not the part of his biography that is likely to raise some eyebrows among members of the ELCA congregations in our synod, and perhaps some of you. Kevin is gay and partnered, a detail that he makes no attempt to conceal, nor does he broadcast it, he simply mentions it the way the majority of us would introduce ourselves by including the name of our spouse and the number of our children.

Besides Kevin, the two other final candidates for Bishop were both women, one of whom is African American. Perhaps I speak out of turn here, as I am still quite new to the deep South, but I suspect you would not have seen a slate of final candidates for Bishop like this in our synod, even as recently as six years ago when Bishop Gordy was elected to his second term as Bishop. I believe this signals something about where we are as a synod, and as a church.

In the above verse, the Holy Spirit is characterized as wind. The word translated wind in this verse is *pneuma* in the Greek, and it is a word that can mean either wind or spirit. Jesus is in fact saying to Nicodemus that the Spirit blows where she chooses, and like the wind you don't know where the Spirit comes from or where she is going. In other words, the Holy Spirit cannot be tamed or domesticated or controlled. And if we allow that the Holy Spirit played a role in the election of our new Bishop, as we indeed hope that she did, then that means that the Holy Spirit led our Synod to a rather remarkable selection, in spite of the New Testament's condemnation of what we call homosexuality, and prohibition of women in leadership in the church.

However, I believe that in many respects the outcome of the Bishop's election is in keeping with the character of the Holy Spirit, who blows where she chooses, and is not limited even by what the Apostles Paul or Timothy have to say. The Holy Spirit blows as we said on Pentecost Sunday, and sometimes upsets the applecart. You've heard the phrase the "winds of change" haven't you? I'm going to go out on a limb here (though not very far I don't think) by saying I

think this is what we are seeing in our church—the winds of the Holy Spirit, blowing and bringing change into our church.


Before the 8:30 a.m. service on Pentecost I was asked why we had changed the seating arrangement in the sanctuary, and then the person who asked the question answered before I had a chance to by saying, “Because you like to change things.” It concerns me a bit that I seem to be acquiring that reputation. Because contrary to what some may think, I don’t like change for change sake; and I’m not in favor of making a change without a good reason. But, it is true that I have initiated some changes in the last few months, the most noticeable, and least popular perhaps having to do with changes in worship. But I can assure you none of the changes I have attempted were made without consideration and prayer.

I don’t know what sort of changes the Holy Spirit may blow in our direction in the weeks, months and even years ahead. But I am confident of this much, life at AGLC or in the ELCA will not remain stagnant, because God abhors stagnation. God through God’s Spirit, is forever making the effort to breathe new life into the church!

In addition, if the Spirit is intent on bringing change in some aspect of the church or our congregational life, you and I can resist it all we want, but the mighty wind that blew into town on Pentecost, will have her way with us!

FUNDRAISER FOR LUTHERIDGE 2019


The mothers from Homework Help are doing a fundraiser to support the ones who are going to Lutheridge this year. They will be selling tamales this Sunday June 2.

Secretary's Report: The April minutes were approved via email consensus on April 19 2019. There are no updates or corrections to the minutes.

Combined Treasurer and Financial Administrator's Report for April

April 2019 Regular Giving was \$20,535.00, which is \$1,175.00 over budget. Expenses were \$15,339.06, which was \$1,000.12 under budget. Giving continues to grow in 2019 as April was the most prosperous month so far! Expenses are down too, so we even made a profit this month!

April 2019 YTD Income was \$4,811.26 less than April 2018 YTD Income.
April 2019 YTD Expenses were \$1,517.29 more than April 2018 YTD Expenses.

2019 Year to Date Giving/Income is \$3,389.57 over budget.
2019 Year to Date Expenses are \$826.67 under budget.

Dedicated Accounts – We have a balance of \$39,543.79 in various accounts, which includes April receipts of \$3,533.00 and expenses of \$47.00 for April 2019 in dedicated accounts.

April 2019 cash on hand is \$98,524.18 which includes \$39,543.79 in Dedicated funds; therefore, not in reserve/not liquid for general expenses.

PASTOR'S REPORT FOR APRIL – MAY 2019

1. Review of Lent/Easter: I believe as a congregation we had a meaningful and fruitful journey through Lent. The most positive experience it seems to me came out of the mid-week Lenten Services. I always enjoy writing little skits or dramas to present the message. However, I think I enjoyed the exploration of Holy Week this year, with myself as a Tour Guide in Jerusalem, and others taking the roles of tourists even more than usual. And I have gotten only positive feedback of these Lenten skits, which of course pleases me. The theme of this year's Lenten skits also provided me with an opportunity to draw Jacob Crowe in by asking him to provide photographs of the holy sites we were talking about from his

- recent visit to Jerusalem. Whenever you can give someone a meaningful role to play in a worship experience or other activity at church it gives them ownership and investment in it.
2. In addition, I was quite pleased with the Holy Week collaboration between AGLC and All Saints. I hope this will pave the way for more of the same. I know from Lois that the musical collaboration was enjoyed by her, and by the majority of the choir, and it made for a wonderful result on Good Friday when we hosted the service and the choir loft was full with choir members from both congregations. My hope is to sit down with Kim Stover soon and talk about how we might build on this collaboration. Finally, I was very pleased by Deb and myself being able to introduce AGLC to something we did with the youth in my former congregation. I'm referring to what Deb calls "Creative Ministry." Doing interpretive movement to a song. It was an uplifting way for us to open our Easter morning service I think. It was evident from the congregation's reaction that most were moved by it. It also provides the youth with an opportunity to make a meaningful contribution to worship, something that is sadly lacking on most occasions in the church. However, I must say that in spite of how well the presentation went on Easter Sunday, putting it together was very frustrating in many respects. Deb had a very difficult time communicating with the youth who were participating, which is one of the major challenges we are facing with the youth ministry in general. She rehearsed with them a number of times prior to Easter. Some of the youth didn't show for the rehearsals. The only time, all five of the youth who presented were together for the Easter presentation was on Easter Sunday. Deb had to rehearse them piecemeal, which is obviously not ideal for a group presentation. However, now that the youth know what this is, and based on the positive reaction from the congregation, I am hoping the youth will want to do more of these going forward and that it will not be as challenging to put a presentation together in the future.
 3. At present we have three small groups meeting. I have dropped in on all three, and from my perspective all three groups operate differently, but all seem to be enjoying their fellowship and to be having meaningful discussions of the issues that are raised. It will be interesting to see if these groups will continue to meet beyond when they are finished with the study book they are using. I will continue to look in on each of the groups at least periodically.
 4. VBS once again this year will be under the direction of Judie Lee, following a theme entitled, "Heroes for God." Judie, has a framework in her mind for how this is to be put together, and she has certain Bible stories she wants to cover with the children in attendance. Anna Reyes, and Becky O'Brien are going to be involved in the leadership besides Judie and myself. I have talked to Judie about arranging planning session and am waiting to hear back from her on when she is able to do this.
 5. We have a date scheduled for a summer kickoff activity for the youth. We are planning to have a Lock-in at the church which is something several of the youth have been looking forward to for awhile. We are planning the event for Friday, May 17th, beginning with a cookout, games and fun activities scheduled for the evening. We will plan to sleep (maybe, I hope so) here at the church that night, have breakfast on Saturday morning, then everyone goes their way. Chaperones will be Deb, Myself, Trish, and Mike Calabrese. So we will have adequate male and female chaperones for the evening and through the night.
 6. Lois Simon and I have plans to meet to discuss Music and Arts this summer. Lois has many things going on in her life, including an eye surgery that she has just undergone, and a new grandbaby on the way soon, as well as vacation plans, so we will have to talk about how realistic it is for her to be able to provide some of the leadership she originally envisioned.
 7. Rudy Beilfuss is preparing to put his home on the market before the end of the month, and he and Scharlene are looking to move to Augusta, and he is searching for someone to assume leadership of the HOST Committee. This will obviously be crucial to ongoing ministries like Homework Help, the Lutheridge Camp Experience, VBS and others. We need to be in prayer that the right person will come forward to lead our HOST Committee when Rudy steps down.
 8. I continue to monitor the situation in the development across the street. Thus far, no one has moved in as far as I can determine, though there is one home and several lots that are identified as being under contract. Thus the Welcome Wagon is still in a holding pattern for the present.
 9. I continue to be in conversation with Pastor Karen Stephenson about coming to speak to our congregation about ministry to the unchurched in one of our Town Meeting formats. From what I am able to determine she does not have every Sunday responsibilities with the Atlanta Bar church because she spoke of filling the pulpit in some other congregations when we last exchanged emails. So I have written to her asking if she has any Sunday

availability—that being the best time for us to hold a healthy gathering of our people to hear and discuss what she has to offer.

10. I had a very productive follow-up meeting with Pastor Kim of All Saints to debrief the experience of both congregations during Holy Week and to talk about future collaborations between our congregations. His take on Holy Week was that the music ministers and choir people from both congregations had a good experience working together. I know I have gotten good positive from Lois, and Kim has heard the same from his folks. Also, their folk were delighted about being asked by me to extinguish some of the candles during the Tenebrae portion of the Good Friday service here. Out of our brainstorming about future collaborative efforts came a few ideas to explore. Since the joining of the two congregations for worship centered around bringing the musicians and choirs together primarily, Pastor Kim suggested we make our next effort centered around music as well. I suggested gathering for one of the minor festival days on the church calendar, like Ascension for example, and make the worship event most about the choirs and the two praise bands (theirs and ours). He also suggested that they might want to join with us to provide school supplies for children, and that this might also be an opportunity to bring the praise bands together. I have given him contact information for Judie Lee and asked him to contact her directly about the idea. Kim has also mentioned the idea of a pulpit exchange again. We will continue to explore these ideas and any others that are raised. I am certainly open to any ideas from members of our congregation, based on our experience of observing Holy Week together.
11. Plans are solidified for a Youth Lock-in at the church this Friday evening through Saturday late morning. We are planning lots of games, showing a movie and building in plenty of “hang-out” time, as well as a cookout for dinner, and breakfast together Saturday morning. Still having difficulty getting the youth to respond and say that they are coming or not, but hopefully we will end up with a decent turn out.
12. We will plan to do something in worship to acknowledge/celebrate Nicole Speddon’s graduation from High School on a Sunday when she can be here for worship.
13. I will be on vacation during Memorial Day Weekend; we will have an ordained pastor as pulpit supply. June 2 I will be gone at synod assembly and John Rhilinger will be preaching.
